MSRAL BUSINESS MEETING:

<u>Website</u>: I created a MSRAL webpage in 2020 and it was almost done and demonstrated to the membership on the business meeting. It had the MSRAL registration website attached for clubs that do not have the space for a registration page on their club websites. The membership wanted to see how to make it the new webpage due to the integration of all the clubs. A committee was formed to look into Word Press and upgrade the page which I am in the process of, then I will update the current information, ie. contacts, club info, etc. and Jim Small will be in charge of archives and history. Once completed, I will gather content editors to develop a team of webpage volunteers.

<u>IO Group Email:</u> This was set up after last year's business meeting as I was MSRAL Chair for two years. It is being used now that I have sparked communication amongst the clubs.

<u>FaceBook:</u> I suggested a MSRAL Face Book page to Sugar Creek in 2018 for the MSRAL Conference and it was setup but no one was posting on it.
